Regulatory framework	Saudi Arabia has recently announced its ratification of the United Nations Convention against Corruption and that it will accede to the International Anti-Corruption Academy. Four corruption related laws, rules and regulations have been prepared, and are in the final stages of the approval process, including: a Protection of Public Funds law; Implementing Regulations for Reporting Corruption Cases; Integrity Protection Rules and Incentives for Whistle-Blowers on Corruption Cases; and Financial Disclosure Rules, and Oath of Office Controls for Some Public officials.
